### NEEDED TO APPLY:

To qualify for an AAT or ATT Apprenticeship position with Armstrong Watson you must have achieved a **minimum of 7 GCSEs at Grade 5 (C) or above, or 6 National Fives, including Maths, English and at least one Science**, and already have achieved or be predicted to achieve a **minimum of 96 UCAS points obtained at A Level, Scottish Highers or BTEC Level 3 or above**. You must also be at least **18 years of age** upon joining the firm.
